TRIP TIPS ARE COMING TO A LOCATION NEAR YOU

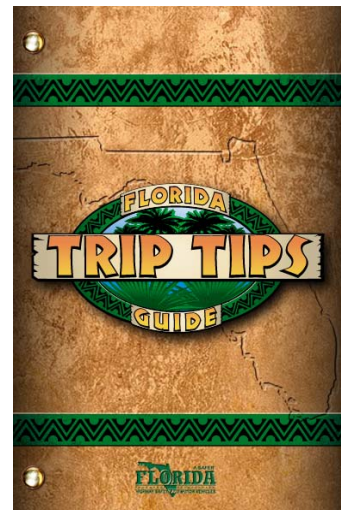
~ Handy guide gives pointers leading to a Safer Florida ~
