Work to continue on northbound Turnpike at Homestead toll plaza for the entire weekend. Traffic headed north from the Keys and Homestead may experience delays.

FORT LAUDERDALE — Work to remove and replace the pavement under the Homestead tolling gantry is scheduled to continue this weekend on northbound Florida's Turnpike. Motorists headed north from the Florida Keys and Homestead may experience traffic delays in the vicinity of the Homestead toll plaza.

From 9 p.m. Friday, Dec. 10, to approximately 1 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 11, both northbound Turnpike lanes will be closed approaching the SunPass-only, tolling gantry at the Homestead toll plaza, and traffic will be diverted through the SunPass and cash tollbooths.

Beginning at 1 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 11, one northbound, SunPass-only express lane will reopen and will remain open for the entire weekend through 6 a.m. Monday, Dec. 13. The SunPass and cash tollbooths also will remain open.

The weekend-long lane closure is needed as part of the ongoing construction project to convert the southern 47 miles of the Turnpike into an [all-electronic open road tolling](#) facility.

Electronic signs will be installed to advise drivers about the lane closure. Motorists should call 5-1-1 or visit www.fl511.com for updated traffic information, before they travel.
