SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

FORT LAUDERDALE — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin and St. Lucie counties, **for the week beginning Sunday, May 31.**

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

TURNPIKE – MILLING AND RESURFACING PROJECTS (MILEPOST 0-9, 11-16 & 20-22)

- One **northbound** lane will be closed on various segments of Florida's Turnpike from Caribbean Boulevard (Exit 12) to north of Coral Reef Drive (Exit 16) from 9:30 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 1, through Thursday, June 4..
- One **southbound** lane will be closed on various segments of the Turnpike between Allapattah Road (Exit 9) and Campbell Drive (Exit 2) from 9:30 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 1, through Thursday, June 4.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Two construction projects are underway to remove the existing pavement and to resurface and restripe various segments of the Turnpike: from the U.S. 1 (Exit 1) to Allapattah Road (Exit 9); from Southwest 216th Street (Exit 11) to Southwest 152nd Street/117th Avenue (Exit 16); and from Southwest 88th Street/Kendall Drive (Exit 20) to Southwest 56th Street/Miller Drive at Milepost 22. New shoulders will be constructed on the ramps at the following interchanges: Campbell Drive, Biscayne Drive, Tallahassee Road and Allapattah Road. The existing paved shoulders will be widened at the ramps to U.S. 1 and to Biscayne Drive. One project is scheduled for completion by the end of 2009; the other is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2010. Combined cost: \$14.4 million.

TURNPIKE – SOUTH FLORIDA INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS (ITS) PROJECT

- No lane closures this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Data collection equipment, including cameras, vehicle detectors and travel-time detectors, along with two electronic, dynamic message signs (DMS) are being installed on Florida's Turnpike from Milepost 0 to Milepost 117

and from Milepost 0X to 4X. The equipment will help the Turnpike's Traffic Management Center identify and manage traffic incidents. The project is scheduled for completion this summer. Approximate project cost: \$20.6 million.

OKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING AND NW 74TH STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)

- One or two lanes in either direction of Florida's Turnpike will be closed beneath the new Northwest 74th Street overpass from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. for two nights — Monday, June 1, and Wednesday, June 3. At least one lane in each direction will remain open.
- **All northbound and southbound** Turnpike lanes will be **closed** between Northwest 106th Street (Exit 34) and Okeechobee Road/U.S. 27 (Exit 35) from 11 p.m. Tuesday, June 2, through 4 a.m. Wednesday, June 3, as crews install a massive sign structure over the roadway.
 - Northbound traffic will be directed to exit the Turnpike at Northwest 106th Street, go east to Northwest 116th Way, north to Okeechobee Road and west to the Turnpike's northbound entrance ramp at that location.
 - Southbound traffic will be directed to exit the Turnpike at Okeechobee Road, head east to Northwest 116th Way, south to Northwest 106th Street and west to Turnpike's southbound entrance ramp at that location.
 - If weather impedes the work Tuesday night, the work and closures will be rescheduled for the evening of Wednesday, June 3.
- On **southbound** Turnpike lane will be closed north and south of Okeechobee toll plaza from 10 p.m. Thursday, June 4, to 5:30 a.m. Friday, June 5. At least two southbound lanes will remain open.
- Also on Thursday night, **all southbound traffic**, from north of Interstate 75 to Okeechobee toll plaza, will be **slowed to 15 mph** for approximately 20 minutes between 11 p.m. Thursday, June 4, and 1 a.m. Friday, June 5.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new SunPass-only interchange is under construction at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in the spring 2010. Approximate cost: \$64.8 million.

BROWARD COUNTY

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT DEERFIELD TOLL PLAZA

- One lane in each direction may be closed on the Sawgrass Expressway between U.S. 441 and the intersection of Waterways Boulevard between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. Monday, June 1, through Thursday, June 4. Two lanes in each direction will remain open.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Deerfield mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries west of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2009. Approximate cost: \$40 million.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 53 to 58)

- One to two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Griffin Road (Exit 53) and Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Tuesday, May 26, through Friday, May 29.

Local roads affected:

- One lane in each direction will be closed 24/7 on Broward Boulevard between East Acre Drive and NW 48th Avenue.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 58 to 66)

- Otherwise one or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) and Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 1, through Friday, June 5.

Local roads affected:

- There will be nighttime lane closures on Commercial Blvd in the vicinity of the Turnpike toll plaza.
- There will be daytime lane closures at SR 7.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is a multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County. The first phase is in its third year of construction on the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) to Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). Approximate project cost: \$265 million.

TURNPIKE – ONE MILE SOUTH OF SAWGRASS INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 70.0 to 70.5)

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike north of Sample Road (Exit 69) and south of Glades Road (Exit 75) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 1, through Friday, June 5.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Broward County is extending Wiles Road to Powerline Road by constructing a bridge over the Turnpike.

PALM BEACH COUNTY

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Lake Worth Road (Exit 93) and Boynton Beach Boulevard (Exit 86) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Monday, June 1, through Friday, June 5.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: In Palm Beach County, Hypoluxo Road is being extended by constructing a bridge over the Turnpike.



Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is part of the Florida Department of Transportation overseeing a 460-mile system of limited-access toll highways: *THE FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE, EXTENDING NORTH FROM HOMESTEAD IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO WILDWOOD IN SUMTER COUNTY, THE SEMINOLE EXPRESSWAY AND SOUTHERN CONNECTOR (TOLL 417) IN SEMINOLE, ORANGE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES, THE BEACHLINE EXPRESSWAY WEST (TOLL 528) IN ORANGE COUNTY, THE POLK PARKWAY (TOLL 570) IN POLK COUNTY, THE VETERANS EXPRESSWAY AND SUNCOAST PARKWAY IN HILLSBOROUGH, PASCO AND HERNANDO COUNTIES (TOLL 589), THE SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY (TOLL 869) IN BROWARD COUNTY, AND THE Daniel Webster Western Beltway Part C (Toll 429) in Orange County.*

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges.
