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SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

FORT LAUDERDALE — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie counties, for the week beginning Sunday, June 29.

All regularly scheduled construction and maintenance lane closures on the Turnpike system of roads will be suspended from 6 a.m., Thursday, July 3 to 11:59 p.m., Monday, July 7 to accommodate holiday traffic volumes.

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

TURNPIKE BRIDGE MAINTENANCE OVER MIAMI GARDENS DRIVE (MILEPOST 1X)

- One or two lanes in each direction will be closed on the Turnpike at Miami Gardens Drive from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for up to three nights — Sunday, June 29, through Wednesday, June 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Work crews will perform bridge maintenance activities.

TURNPIKE / HOMESTEAD EXTENSION BRIDGE PAINTING (MILEPOST 44-46)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The bridge that connects northbound Florida's Turnpike to the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike will be cleaned, primed and painted. The project is scheduled for completion in July 2008. Approximate cost: \$1 million.

OKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING AND NW 74TH STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)

- One lane in each direction will be closed on Florida's Turnpike, north and south of Okeechobee toll plaza, from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday, June 29, and Monday, June 30, for installation of median guardrail. At least two lanes in each direction will remain open.
- All southbound Turnpike traffic will be paced to 5 mph for approximately 20 minutes at a time from north of the Northwest 106th Street interchange (Milepost 34) to the toll plaza (Milepost 32) as workers install a massive sign structure over the traffic lanes.
 - Between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. for up to two nights Tuesday, July 1, and Wednesday, July 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new SunPass-only interchange will be constructed at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2009/early 2010. Approximate cost: \$63.4 million.

BROWARD COUNTY

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY WIDENING – ATLANTIC BOULEVARD TO CORAL RIDGE DRIVE

- No lane closures scheduled. Construction work is now complete.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Consists of widening the Sawgrass Expressway from four to six lanes, construction of sound walls and other improvements.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT SUNRISE TOLL PLAZA

- One lane in each direction on the Sawgrass Expressway may be closed as needed Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 2, during daytime off-peak hours and also at night, from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., in the area of the Sunrise toll plaza.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Sunrise mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries south of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008. Approximate cost: \$26.2 million.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT RAMPS

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: SunPass-only lanes have been constructed at eight ramp toll plazas on the Sawgrass Expressway, including those at Commercial Boulevard, Atlantic Boulevard, Sample Road and University Drive. The project will be completed this summer, once the toll equipment installation is finalized. Approximate cost: \$13.9 million.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT DEERFIELD TOLL PLAZA

- **All eastbound lanes** on the Sawgrass Expressway, between Lyons Road and the Deerfield toll plaza, will be closed from 11 p.m. Tuesday, July 1, through 6 a.m. Wednesday, July 2. Traffic should exit at Lyons Road and follow the detour signs.
- **Eastbound Sawgrass on-ramp from Lyons Road** – Closed from 11 p.m. Tuesday, July 1, through 6 a.m. Wednesday, July 2. Traffic should stay on Lyons Road and follow the detour signs.
- One lane in each direction may be closed on the Sawgrass Expressway from **Lyons Road** to **Florida's Turnpike** between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 2.
- **Westbound Sawgrass off-ramp to Lyons Road** – Closed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday, June 29, through Wednesday, July 2.
- **Wide-load vehicles** (exceeding the 12-foot-wide lane) **traveling from the southbound Turnpike to the westbound Sawgrass** are not able to get through the Deerfield mainline toll plaza, as the **toll lanes** have been **narrowed** for construction. Wide-loads should exit the Turnpike at Glades Road (Exit 75), go west to Lyons Road and then south to the Sawgrass Expressway.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Deerfield mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries west of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2010. Approximate cost: \$39 million.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – 'SMART HIGHWAYS' PROJECT

- One lane in either direction may be closed on nine cross streets, approaching the Sawgrass Expressway, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 2.
 - Only one interchange cross street will be affected at any one time as crews work on electronic signs.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Electronic, dynamic message signs (DMS) are being installed on nine cross streets with interchanges at the Sawgrass Expressway, from Sunrise Boulevard to Lyons Road, to advise drivers about traffic incidents and conditions on the Sawgrass Expressway as they approach the expressway's entrance ramps. The project also includes the installation of a road weather information system, a travel time system, a speed monitoring system and an additional DMS on the Sawgrass Expressway. The project is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2008. Approximate cost: \$3.6 million.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 53 to 58)

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Griffin Road (Exit 53) and Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 2.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 58 to 66)

- Two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) and Commercial Boulevard (Exit 62) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 2.

Local roadways affected:

One or two lanes both northbound and southbound on Lyons Road will be closed during daytime and some nighttime hours.

Toll plazas affected:

Commercial Boulevard Toll Plaza (Exit 62) - One of the three toll lanes at the entrance to southbound Turnpike and one lane exiting the plaza will be closed 24/7.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is the first phase of a multi-year, multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County from six to eight lanes. The first phase is in its third year of construction on the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) to Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). Approximate project cost: \$265 million. Completion is anticipated during the summer of 2010.

TURNPIKE ONE MILE SOUTH OF SAWGRASS INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 70.5 to 71.5)

- Restricted outside shoulder and inside shoulder in both directions 24/7 until the completion of the project.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Broward County is extending Wiles Road to Powerline Road by constructing a bridge over the Turnpike.

PALM BEACH COUNTY

ATLANTIC AVENUE INTERCHANGE RE-CONFIGURATION (MILEPOST 80-82)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Widening of Florida's Turnpike from four to six lanes between the Atlantic Avenue interchange and the Lantana toll plaza, including the reconstruction of the Atlantic Avenue interchange. The interchange project started in 2005 and is scheduled for completion in early 2009. Approximate cost: \$81 million.

TURNPIKE - ONE MILE NORTH OF LANTANA TOLL PLAZA (MILEPOST 89)

- Restricted outside shoulder and inside shoulder in both directions 24/7 until the completion of the project.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Palm Beach County is extending Hypoluxo Road over the Turnpike.

TURNPIKE- OKEECHOBEE BOULEVARD TO NORTH OF INDIANTOWN ROAD (MILEPOST 99-117)

- Northbound inside lane closure from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday, June 29 to Wednesday, July 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: AT&T will be performing maintenance on existing conduit.

MARTIN COUNTY

TURNPIKE- NORTH OF INDIANTOWN ROAD TO BECKER ROAD (MILEPOST 117-138)

- Northbound inside lane closure from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday, June 29 to Wednesday, July 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: AT&T will be performing maintenance on existing conduit.

ST. LUCIE COUNTY

TURNPIKE– BECKER ROAD TO SOUTH OF FORT PIERCE (MILEPOST 138-151)

- Northbound inside lane closure from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday, June 29 to Wednesday, July 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: AT&T will be performing maintenance on existing conduit.

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges.
