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SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

FORT LAUDERDALE — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin and St. Lucie counties, **for the week beginning Sunday, Oct. 4.**

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

TURNPIKE – MILLING AND RESURFACING PROJECTS (MILEPOST 0-9, 11-16 & 20-22)

- One or two **southbound** lanes will be closed on various segments of Florida's Turnpike between the Homestead toll plaza and Coral Reef Drive (Exit 16) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, Oct. 5, through Thursday, Oct. 8.
- The left lane and median shoulder will be closed on various segments of the **southbound** Turnpike from north of Campbell Drive (Exit 2) to S. Dixie Highway/U.S. 1 (Exit 1) from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. for three nights, Sunday, Oct. 4, through Tuesday, Oct. 6.
- The left lane and median shoulder will be closed on various segments of the **northbound** Turnpike from S. Dixie Highway/U.S. 1 (Exit 1) to north of Campbell Drive (Exit 2) from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. for two nights, Wednesday, Oct. 7, and Thursday, Oct. 8.
 - At least one lane in each direction will remain open.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Two construction projects are underway to remove the existing pavement and to resurface and restripe various segments of the Turnpike: from the U.S. 1 (Exit 1) to Allapattah Road (Exit 9); from Southwest 216th Street (Exit 11) to Southwest 152nd Street/117th Avenue (Exit 16); and from Southwest 88th Street/Kendall Drive (Exit 20) to Southwest 56th Street/Miller Drive at Milepost 22. New shoulders will be constructed on the ramps at the following interchanges: Campbell Drive, Biscayne Drive, Tallahassee Road and Allapattah Road. The existing paved shoulders will be widened at the ramps to U.S. 1 and to Biscayne Drive. One project is scheduled for completion by the end of 2009; the other is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2010. Combined cost: \$14.4 million.

OKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING AND NW 74TH STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)

- One Turnpike lane in each direction will be closed north and south of the Okeechobee toll plaza from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sunday, Oct. 4, through Thursday, Oct. 8, for drainage related activities. At least one lane in each direction will remain open.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new SunPass-only interchange is under construction at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in the spring 2010. Approximate cost: \$64.8 million.

TURNPIKE – BRIDGE PAINTING AT MIAMI GARDENS DRIVE

- One or two lanes in each direction on Miami Gardens Drive will be closed overnight beneath the Turnpike overpass from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday, Oct. 5, through Thursday, Oct. 8. Two lanes in each direction will remain open between 7 and 11 p.m.; one lane in each direction will remain open between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The project consists of cleaning and painting the Turnpike bridge over Miami Gardens Drive. Work began in late August and is scheduled for completion by the end of January 2010. Approximate cost: \$260,000.

BROWARD COUNTY

TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 53 to 58)

- Two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Griffin Road (Exit 53) and Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, October 5, through Friday, October 9.

Intersecting highway and ramps affected:

- Periodic, off peak, night time lane closures both eastbound and westbound on I-595 under the Turnpike from Monday,

TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 58 to 66)

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) and Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66) from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, October 5, through Friday, October 9.

Local road affected:

- Periodic, off peak, night time lane closures in both directions on Commercial Boulevard from Monday, October 5, through Friday, October 9.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is a multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County. As of September 15 there will be three active phases in progress between the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) and Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). Approximate project cost: \$286 million.

PALM BEACH COUNTY

TURNPIKE INTERCHANGE RECONFIGURATION – LAKE WORTH ROAD (MILEPOST 93)

One or two lanes in the southbound direction will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between the West Palm Beach Service Plaza (Milepost 94) and Hypoluxo (Milepost 90) between 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Monday, October 5, through Friday, October 9.

Local roads affected:

- Periodic, off peak, nighttime lane closures both eastbound and westbound on Lake Worth Road from Monday, September 28, through Thursday, October 1.
- Full closure on Lake Worth Road just west of the Turnpike entrance on Friday, Saturday and Sunday night from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. each night.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is an interchange reconfiguration at the Turnpike's Lake Worth Interchange (Exit 93) which will split the existing plaza. A new plaza will be built in the southwest quadrant, providing separate access for northbound and southbound drivers. Approximate project cost: \$17.5 million.

ST. LUCIE COUNTY

TURNPIKE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT – FT. PIERCE (EXIT 152) & ST LUCIE (EXIT 142)

- No closures to report this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Two improvement projects will be underway in St. Lucie County. The Port St Lucie (Exit 142) northbound interchange ramps will be resurfaced and realigned. This project begins in July and is projected to be complete in October. The second project is an improvement of the northbound off ramp at the Ft Pierce interchange (Exit 152). The ramp is being realigned. This project started in June and is projected to be complete in December. Combined costs for these two projects are approximately: \$2.8 million.

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY

TURNPIKE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT – (Milepost 173) to (Milepost 179)

- Periodic daytime off peak lane closures will take place on the northbound and southbound lanes of the Turnpike Monday, October 5, through Friday, October 9.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Resurfacing and safety improvement will take place on the Turnpike between Ft Pierce area and Fort Drum Service Plaza. This project starts this August and is projected to be complete in January 2010. Cost for this project is approximately: \$4.3 million.

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is part of the Florida Department of Transportation overseeing a 460-mile system of limited-access toll highways: *THE FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE, EXTENDING NORTH FROM HOMESTEAD IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO WILDWOOD IN SUMTER COUNTY, THE SEMINOLE EXPRESSWAY AND SOUTHERN CONNECTOR (TOLL 417) IN SEMINOLE, ORANGE AND OSCEOLA COUNTIES, THE BEACHLINE EXPRESSWAY WEST (TOLL 528) IN ORANGE COUNTY, THE POLK PARKWAY (TOLL 570) IN POLK COUNTY, THE VETERANS EXPRESSWAY AND SUNCOAST PARKWAY IN HILLSBOROUGH, PASCO AND HERNANDO COUNTIES (TOLL 589), THE SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY (TOLL 869) IN BROWARD COUNTY, AND THE Daniel Webster Western Beltway Part C (Toll 429) in Orange County.*

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges.
