SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

FORT LAUDERDALE — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie counties, **for the week beginning Sunday, November 16.**

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

Motorists will encounter heavy congestion and traffic delays on Florida's Turnpike in the Homestead area due to the **NASCAR races** scheduled for **Sunday, Nov. 16**, at Homestead-Miami Speedway. Congestion is expected to peak between noon and 4 p.m. in the southbound direction and between 8 and 11 p.m. in the northbound direction.

TURNPIKE – 'SMART HIGHWAYS' PROJECT (MILEPOST 2-29)

- Closures as needed at the following locations on the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike (HEFT) as crews work on installation of antennae poles and electronic, dynamic message signs (DMS).
 - Milepost 2-4: one lane in each direction periodically closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 am Monday, Nov. 17, through Thursday, Nov. 20.
 - Milepost 10-14: one lane in each direction periodically closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 am Sunday, Nov. 16, through Thursday, Nov. 20.
 - Milepost 16-19: one northbound lane periodically closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 am Sunday, Nov. 16, through Thursday, Nov. 20.
 - Milepost 27-29: one southbound lane periodically closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 am Monday, Nov. 17, through Wednesday, Nov. 19.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) project includes the installation of fiber optic cable, vehicle detection system (VDS) devices and two dynamic message signs (DMS) on the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike. The project is scheduled for completion in March 2009. Approximate cost: \$20.5 million.

OKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING AND NW 74TH STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)

- One SunPass express (open-road tolling) lane on the southbound Turnpike lane will be closed south of the Okeechobee toll plaza from 10 p.m. Monday, Nov. 17, to 5 a.m. Tuesday, Nov. 18, for work in the median. One SunPass express lane will remain open; the SunPass/cash tollbooths will not be affected.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new SunPass-only interchange is under construction at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2009/early 2010. Approximate cost: \$63.4 million.

BROWARD COUNTY

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT DEERFIELD TOLL PLAZA

- One lane in each direction may be closed on the Sawgrass Expressway from Lyons Road to Florida's Turnpike between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 16, through Thursday, Nov. 20.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Deerfield mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries west of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2009. Approximate cost: \$39 million.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 53 to 58)

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Griffin Road (Exit 53) and Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, Nov. 17, through Friday, Nov. 21

TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (MILEPOST 58 to 66)

- One or two lanes in both directions will be closed periodically on the Turnpike between Sunrise Boulevard (Exit 58) and Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66) from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, Nov. 17, through Friday, Nov. 21.
- There is a significant traffic shift between the Pompano Beach Service Plaza and Commercial Blvd. (Exit 62). This shift will be in place for the next few months.

Toll plazas affected:

- Single lane nighttime closure on Commercial Boulevard
- Single lane daytime closures on Lyons Road

Toll plazas affected:

Commercial Boulevard Toll Plaza (Exit 62) - One of the three toll lanes at the entrance to southbound Turnpike and one lane exiting the plaza will be closed 24/7.

There will be periodic closures on the SUNPASS ONLY ramp located on the west side of the Turnpike from eastbound Commercial Blvd. entering southbound Turnpike.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is the first phase of a multi-year, multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County. The first phase is in its third year of construction on the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) to Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). Approximate project cost: \$265 million. Completion is anticipated summer of 2010.

TURNPIKE – ONE MILE SOUTH OF SAWGRASS INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 70.0 to 70.5)

- Restricted outside shoulder and inside shoulder in both directions 24/7 until the completion of the project.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Broward County is extending Wiles Road to Powerline Road by constructing a bridge over the Turnpike.

PALM BEACH COUNTY

ATLANTIC AVENUE INTERCHANGE RE-CONFIGURATION (MILEPOST 80-82)

- One lane periodically closed both northbound and southbound 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, Nov. 17, through Thursday, Nov. 20, for lane striping.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Widening of Florida's Turnpike from four to six lanes between the Atlantic Avenue interchange and the Lantana toll plaza, including the reconstruction of the Atlantic Avenue interchange. The interchange project started in 2005 and is scheduled for completion in early 2009. Approximate cost: \$81 million.

TURNPIKE – ONE MILE NORTH OF LANTANA TOLL PLAZA (MILEPOST 89)

- One lane in each direction closed 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. from Sunday, Nov. 16, through Thursday, Nov. 20, for bridge work, milling, paving and re-striping.
- Restricted outside shoulder and inside shoulder in both directions 24/7 until the completion of the project.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Palm Beach County is extending Hypoluxo Road over the Turnpike.

ST.LUCIE COUNTY

TURNPIKE UTILITY WORK– BECKER ROAD TO PORT PIERCE ROAD (MILEPOST 138-152)

- All **southbound** and **northbound** Turnpike traffic will be slowed to 15 to 20 mph from north of Becker Road (Exit 138) to the south of Fort Pierce Road (Milepost 152) for 15 to 20 minutes at a time between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 17 and Tuesday, Nov. 18. FHP and local law enforcement will direct the operation to allow FPL to reinstall electrical conductors across the Turnpike.



Traffic and Travel Info

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is part of the Florida Department of Transportation overseeing a 460-mile system of limited-access toll highways: *THE FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE, EXTENDING NORTH FROM HOMESTEAD IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO WILDWOOD IN SUMTER COUNTY, THE SEMINOLE EXPRESSWAY AND SOUTHERN CONNECTOR (TOLL 417) IN SEMINOLE, ORANGE AND Osceola COUNTIES, THE BEACHLINE EXPRESSWAY WEST (TOLL 528) IN ORANGE COUNTY, THE POLK PARKWAY (TOLL 570) IN POLK COUNTY, THE VETERANS EXPRESSWAY AND SUNCOAST PARKWAY IN HILLSBOROUGH, PASCO AND HERNANDO COUNTIES (TOLL 589), THE SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY (TOLL 869) IN BROWARD COUNTY, AND THE Daniel Webster Western Beltway Part C (Toll 429) in Orange County.*

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges. SunPass customers typically pay 25 cents less than cash customers at most toll plazas and exits on Turnpike roads. For information on SunPass®, please contact 1-888-TOLL-FLA (865-5352).
