### SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

**FORT LAUDERDALE** (May 10, 2007) — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie counties, **for the week beginning Sunday, May 13.**

Speeding fines double in construction zones when workers are present. Motorists should drive with caution through the work zones and adhere to posted detour signs and speed limits.

#### **MIAMI-DADE COUNTY**

##### **TANDEM-TRUCK PARKING LOT AT THE GOLDEN GLADES INTERCHANGE**

- Connector **ramp closed**, and motorists traveling from northbound SR 9 and US 441(SR 7) to the northbound Turnpike and westbound SR 826 (Palmetto Expressway) will be detoured.
- Motorists should follow the **detour** signs and take northbound US 441 to the Northwest 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue Extension, go west and connect to the northbound Turnpike or westbound SR 826.
- Ramp closure and detour in effect from **10 p.m. to 5 a.m.** Monday, May 14, through Wednesday, May 16.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** A new tandem-truck parking lot will be constructed at the Golden Glades interchange, just off the I-95 connector road, and will replace the existing truck staging area located at the Turnpike's Golden Glades toll plaza. Tandem-truck drivers will be able to use the new lot to temporarily park one of their two trailers while using local roads to deliver goods. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in the summer. Approximate cost: \$1.2 million.

##### **OKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA CONVERSION AND NW 74<sup>TH</sup> STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)**

- One southbound Turnpike lane may be closed between Northwest 106<sup>th</sup> Street and the Okeechobee toll plaza, from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17. At least two southbound lanes will remain open.
- **Wide-load vehicles** will not be able to get through the Okeechobee mainline toll plaza, as the **toll lanes** have been **narrowed** for construction. When southbound, wide-loads should exit at Northwest 106<sup>th</sup> Street (Exit 34) and reenter the Turnpike at Northwest 41<sup>st</sup> Street (Exit 29). When northbound, wide-loads should exit at 41<sup>st</sup> Street and reenter the Turnpike at 106<sup>th</sup> Street.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new

SunPass-only interchange will be constructed at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2009. Approximate cost: \$63.4 million.

### **CONSTRUCTION ON STATE ROAD 836 (DOLPHIN EXPRESSWAY) AT THE TURNPIKE INTERCHANGE (Milepost 26)**

- Two of three lanes will remain closed 24/7, until further notice, on the southbound Turnpike exit ramp to SR 836 (Exit 26). One lane will remain open.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The closures are part of a Miami-Dade Expressway Authority (MDX) construction project. ### **ALEXANDER ALDEN WARE MEMORIAL CABLE BARRIER SYSTEM – THROUGHOUT MIAMI-DADE COUNTY**

- No scheduled lane closures this week.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Canal barrier system named in memory of Alexander Alden Ware who died after his mother's car went into a canal near Lake Worth Road. A mixture of cable barrier and guardrail will be installed throughout Palm Beach, St. Lucie and Miami-Dade counties. In Miami-Dade County, 16.2 miles of canal will be protected through this project. The project started in September 2006 and is anticipated to be completed in the summer of 2007. Approximate cost in all counties: \$20.5 million.

## **BROWARD COUNTY**

### **SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY WIDENING – ATLANTIC BOULEVARD TO FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE**

- One lane in each direction may be closed and one lane in each direction may be open along various segments of the Sawgrass Expressway **between Atlantic Boulevard and Florida's Turnpike**, Sunday, May 13, through Thursday, May 17. Northbound/eastbound lane may be closed between 7:30 p.m. and 6:30 a.m.; southbound/westbound lane may be closed between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- **On-ramp from Lyons Road to westbound Sawgrass** – Closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday, May 14, through Tuesday, May 15.
- **Westbound Sawgrass off-ramp to southbound US 441** – Closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Tuesday, May 15, through Thursday, May 17.
- **US 441** – Only one lane in each direction open beneath the Sawgrass from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- **Lyons Road** – Only one lane in each direction open beneath the Sawgrass from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Consists of widening the Sawgrass Expressway from four to six lanes, construction of sound walls and other improvements. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008.

### **SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT SUNRISE TOLL PLAZA**

- One or two lanes in each direction may be closed periodically north and south of the Sunrise toll plaza between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. Sunday, May 13, through Thursday, May 17.
- Motorists should slow down as they approach the toll plaza, when construction activities are underway.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Sunrise mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries south of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008. Approximate cost: \$26.2 million.

### **SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT RAMPS**

- No closures scheduled this week.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** SunPass-only lanes will be constructed at eight ramp toll plazas on the Sawgrass Expressway, including those at Commercial Boulevard, Atlantic Boulevard, Sample Road and University Drive. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008. Approximate cost: \$13.9 million.

#### **TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (Milepost 53 to 58)**

- Periodic, double-lane closures on the Turnpike, northbound and southbound, between Griffin Road and Sunrise Boulevard (Milepost 53 to 58). One lane will remain open at all times.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

#### **TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (Milepost 58 to 66)**

- Periodic, double-lane closures on the Turnpike, northbound and southbound, between Sunrise Blvd. and Atlantic Ave. (Milepost 58 to 66). At least one lane will remain open at all times.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** This project is the first phase of a multi-year, multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County from six to eight lanes. The first phase to widen the Turnpike has started on the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) to Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). In addition to road-widening work, an important component of this project is the construction of sound barrier walls which will be built along residential areas. Approximate project cost: \$265 million. Completion is anticipated during the summer of 2010.

### **PALM BEACH COUNTY**

#### **ATLANTIC AVENUE INTERCHANGE RE-CONFIGURATION (Milepost 80-82)**

- Atlantic Avenue immediately under Florida's Turnpike will be **CLOSED** around-the-clock for bridge demolition from Saturday, May 12 at 6 a.m. through Sunday, May 13 at 9 p.m. No ramps will be affected by this closure. See attached diagram for closure location.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Widening of Florida's Turnpike from four to six lanes between the Atlantic Avenue interchange and the Lantana Toll Plaza, including the reconstruction of the Atlantic Avenue interchange. The interchange project started in 2005 and is scheduled for completion in 2009. Approximate cost: \$81 million.

#### **TURNPIKE / JOG ROAD SUNPASS-ONLY INTERCHANGE - NORTH OF SOUTHERN BOULEVARD (Milepost 98)**

- No scheduled lane closures this week.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** A new, partial SunPass-only interchange is being built at Jog Road. The future interchange will feature ramps to and from the south only. Started in the fall of 2005 and is scheduled for completion in 2007. Approximate cost: \$12.7 million.

#### **TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF S.R. 710/BEELINE HWY TO NORTH OF JUPITER (Milepost 107-118)**

- One southbound lane will be closed periodically between Milepost 109 and Milepost 118. One lane in each direction will remain open.
- Sunday, May 13, between 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of S.R. 710/Beeline Hwy to north of Jupiter (Indiantown Rd.). This resurfacing project started in April 2006 and is scheduled for completion in early 2008. Approximate cost: \$14.6 million.

#### **ALEXANDER ALDEN WARE MEMORIAL CABLE BARRIER SYSTEM – THROUGHOUT PALM BEACH COUNTY**

- No scheduled lane closures this week.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Canal barrier system named in memory of Alexander Alden Ware who died after his mother's car went into a canal near Lake Worth Road. A mixture of cable barrier and guardrail will be installed throughout Palm Beach, St. Lucie and Miami-Dade counties. In Palm Beach County, 48.1 miles of canal will be protected through this project. The project started in September 2006 and is anticipated to be completed in summer 2007. Approximate cost in all counties: \$20.5 million.

### **MARTIN COUNTY**

#### **TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF JUPITER TO SOUTH OF STUART (Milepost 117-125)**

- One lane in each direction closed periodically between Milepost 117 and Milepost 125. One lane in each direction will remain open.
- Sunday, May 13, between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Jupiter (Indiantown Rd.) to south of Stuart (Martin Downs Blvd.). This resurfacing project started in April 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$9.5 million.

#### **TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF JUPITER TO NORTH OF STUART (Milepost 125-138)**

- Northbound single-lane will be closed periodically between Milepost 125 and Milepost 138. One lane in each direction will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 4 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Southbound single-lane will be closed periodically between Milepost 125 and Milepost 138. One lane in each direction will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Jupiter (Indiantown Rd.) to north of Stuart (Martin Downs Blvd.). This resurfacing project started in October 2006 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$10.4 million.

#### **STUART RAMP BRIDGE CLEARANCE (Milepost 132-134)**

- One lane in each direction closed periodically between Milepost 132 and Milepost 134. One lane in each direction will remain open. No lane closures will occur southbound during to morning peak periods and northbound during the afternoon peak periods.
- Sunday, May 13, through Monday, May 14, between 8:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Crews will be working to increase the vertical clearance (height) of the Stuart ramp bridge, as well as repair damaged bridge beams. The project began in January, and is scheduled for completion in May 2007. Approximate cost: \$2.78 million.

### **ST. LUCIE COUNTY**

#### **TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF STUART TO NORTH OF FORT PIERCE (Milepost 138-153)**

- *Daytime* - One lane in each direction closed periodically between Milepost 138 and Milepost 150. One lane in each direction will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.
- Monday, May 14, through Thursday, May 17, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- Friday, May 18, between 7 a.m. and 12 p.m.
- One lane in each direction closed periodically between Milepost 150 and Milepost 153. One lane in each direction will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.
- Sunday, May 13, through Thursday, May 17, between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Stuart (Martin Downs Blvd.) to north of Fort Pierce (SR 70/Okeechobee Rd.) This resurfacing project started in September 2006 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$15.8 million.

## INTERCHANGE CONSTRUCTION AT BECKER ROAD (Milepost 138-139)

- *The Becker Road interchange will open to traffic May 11 at approximately 5 p.m.*

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The City of Port St. Lucie has built a SunPass-only interchange to connect Florida's Turnpike with Becker Road, including the construction of new bridges over the Turnpike to accommodate a widened Becker Road.

### ALEXANDER ALDEN WARE MEMORIAL CABLE BARRIER SYSTEM – THROUGHOUT ST. LUCIE COUNTY

- No scheduled lane closures this week.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Canal barrier system named in memory of Alexander Alden Ware who died after his mother's car went into a canal near Lake Worth Road. A mixture of cable barrier and guardrail will be installed throughout Palm Beach, St. Lucie and Miami-Dade counties. In St. Lucie County, 28.3 miles of canal will be protected through this project. The project started in September 2006 and is anticipated to be completed in the summer of 2007. Approximate cost in all counties: \$20.5 million.



Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is part of the Florida Department of Transportation overseeing a 454-mile system of limited-access toll highways: the Florida's Turnpike, extending north from Homestead in Miami-Dade County to Wildwood in Sumter County, the Seminole Expressway and Southern Connector (Toll 417) in Seminole, Orange and Osceola counties, the Beachline Expressway West (Toll 528) in Orange County, the Polk Parkway (Toll 570) in Polk County, the Veterans Expressway and Suncoast Parkway in Hillsborough, Pasco and Hernando counties (Toll 589), the Sawgrass Expressway (Toll 869) in Broward County, and the Daniel Webster Western Beltway Part C (Toll 429) in Orange County.

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges.
