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SOUTH FLORIDA AND TREASURE COAST WEEKLY LANE CLOSURES AND WORK ZONE ADVISORY

FORT LAUDERDALE (Sept. 27, 2007) — Florida's Turnpike announces updated lane closures and work zones due to construction and maintenance projects in Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie counties, **for the week beginning Sunday, Sept. 30.**

Speeding fines double in construction zones when workers are present. Motorists should drive with caution through the work zones and adhere to posted detour signs and speed limits.

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

HOMESTEAD TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING (MILEPOST 10)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

BIRD ROAD TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING (MILEPOST 22)

- Bird Road northbound toll plaza – One SunPass-only lane and one cash lane closed from 8 p.m. Monday, Oct. 1, to 6 a.m. Tuesday, Oct. 2. Depending on weather conditions, the closure may be rescheduled for later in the week.
- In addition toll lanes may be closed as needed, both northbound and southbound, during off-peak hours.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Bird Road and Homestead mainline toll plazas will be converted into open-road tolling plazas that will allow SunPass customers to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash customers will continue to pay at the existing tollbooths. Construction is scheduled for completion this winter season. Approximate (combined) cost: \$15.3 million.

NORTHWEST 106TH STREET INTERCHANGE (EXIT 34)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Northwest 106th Street interchange will be converted into a SunPass-only interchange. Once the project is completed, cash will not be accepted at the toll plazas. Construction is scheduled for completion in November. Approximate cost: \$200,000.

OOKEECHOBEE TOLL PLAZA OPEN ROAD TOLLING AND NW 74TH STREET INTERCHANGE (MILEPOST 32)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.
- **Wide-load vehicles** (exceeding the 12-foot-wide lane) will not be able to get through the Okeechobee mainline toll plaza, as the **toll lanes** have been **narrowed** for construction. When southbound, wide-loads should exit at Northwest 106th Street (Exit 34) and reenter the Turnpike at Northwest 41st Street (Exit 29). When northbound, wide-loads should exit at 41st Street and reenter the Turnpike at 106th Street.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Okeechobee mainline toll plaza will be converted into an open-road tolling plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to travel at highway speeds while their toll is collected via SunPass equipment overhead ... no gates, no tollbooths. Cash-paying motorists will pull off the highway onto ramps with traditional tollbooths and then merge back onto the travel lanes. A new SunPass-only interchange will be constructed at Northwest 74th Street. Construction began in January 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2009. Approximate cost: \$63.4 million.

SIGN MAINTENANCE (MILEPOST 16-49)

- Two northbound **or** southbound lanes will be closed along various sections of the Turnpike between the Coral Reef Drive and Hollywood Boulevard interchanges. At least one lane will remain open in the direction of the closure.
- From 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. for three nights, Tuesday, Oct. 2, through Thursday, Oct. 4.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Work crews will perform routine sign repairs and maintenance. The lane closures will be in place for approximately 30 minutes at each sign location.

BROWARD COUNTY

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY WIDENING – ATLANTIC BOULEVARD TO FLORIDA’S TURNPIKE

- One lane in each direction may be closed and one lane in each direction may be open along various segments of the Sawgrass Expressway **between Atlantic Boulevard and Florida’s Turnpike**, Sunday, Sept. 30, through Thursday, Oct. 4. Northbound/eastbound lane may be closed between 7:30 p.m. and 6:30 a.m.; southbound/westbound lane may be closed between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Consists of widening the Sawgrass Expressway from four to six lanes, construction of sound walls and other improvements. The project is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2008.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT SUNRISE TOLL PLAZA

- No lane closures scheduled this week.
- **Wide-load vehicles** (exceeding the 12-foot-wide lane) traveling **northbound** will not be able to get through the **Sunrise mainline toll plaza**, as the **toll lanes** have been **narrowed** for construction. Wide-loads should exit at Sunrise Boulevard, follow the **detour** signs and reenter the Sawgrass Expressway at Oakland Park Boulevard. This detour will remain in effect through late August.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Sunrise mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries south of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008. Approximate cost: \$26.2 million.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT RAMPS

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: SunPass-only lanes will be constructed at eight ramp toll plazas on the Sawgrass Expressway, including those at Commercial Boulevard, Atlantic Boulevard, Sample Road and University Drive. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2008. Approximate cost: \$13.9 million.

SAWGRASS EXPRESSWAY – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT DEERFIELD TOLL PLAZA

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Deerfield mainline toll plaza on the Sawgrass Expressway will be converted into a high-tech, open-road tolling (ORT) plaza that will allow motorists with SunPass to pay their toll while traveling at highway speeds of 65 mph. The work entails constructing SunPass-only gantries west of the existing plaza and removing the center tollbooths from the existing toll plaza. The project is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2009. Approximate cost: \$39 million.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – GRIFFIN ROAD TO SUNRISE BOULEVARD (Milepost 53 to 58)

- One or two lanes in each direction closed periodically on the Turnpike between Griffin Road and Sunrise Boulevard Monday, Oct. 1, through Friday, Oct. 5.

Local roadways affected:

- Griffin Road – One lane closed periodically throughout the day to move equipment Monday through Friday.
- Peters Road – One eastbound lane closed over the Turnpike from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday.

TURNPIKE WIDENING – SUNRISE BOULEVARD TO ATLANTIC BOULEVARD (Milepost 58 to 66)

- Two lanes in each direction may be closed Monday, Monday, Oct. 1, through Friday, Oct. 5, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., between Sunrise Blvd. and Atlantic Blvd. (Milepost 58 to 66). At least one lane will remain open at all times.

*Toll Plazas affected:

- Commercial Boulevard Toll Plaza (Exit 62)- Beginning Monday, October 1st, late morning, one of the three southbound, toll plaza lanes entering the Commercial Boulevard Interchange will be closed until the end of this year.
- Cypress Creek Toll Plaza (Milepost 63) – Undergoing nightly, multiple lane closures due to the plaza's partial conversion to Open Road Tolling.

Local roadways affected:

- Commercial Boulevard – Two westbound lanes closed over the Turnpike between 9 p.m. and 5. a.m. Monday through Friday.
- Lyons Road – One lane in each direction closed under the Turnpike between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project is the first phase of a multi-year, multi-million dollar construction program to widen Florida's Turnpike in Broward County from six to eight lanes. The first phase is in its second year of construction on the southbound lanes from Griffin Road (Exit 53) to Atlantic Boulevard (Exit 66). Approximate project cost: \$265 million. Completion is anticipated during the summer of 2010.

PALM BEACH COUNTY

ATLANTIC AVENUE INTERCHANGE RE-CONFIGURATION (Milepost 80-82)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Widening of Florida's Turnpike from four to six lanes between the Atlantic Avenue interchange and the Lantana toll plaza, including the reconstruction of the Atlantic Avenue interchange. The interchange project started in 2005 and is scheduled for completion in 2009. Approximate cost: \$81 million.

TURNPIKE – OPEN ROAD TOLLING AT LANTANA TOLL PLAZA (Milepost 88)

- No lane closures scheduled this week.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Lantana toll plaza is being retrofitted to provide open road tolling for SunPass motorists, who will be able to pay the toll while traveling at 55 mph. The project is scheduled for completion this winter.

TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF S.R. 710/BEELINE HWY TO NORTH OF JUPITER (Milepost 107-118)

- PGA Boulevard (Exit 109) – Southbound on ramp will be CLOSED from Sunday, Sept 30 thru Oct. 1 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. each day.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of S.R. 710/Beeline Hwy to north of Jupiter (Indiantown Road). This resurfacing project started in April 2006 and is scheduled for completion in early 2008. Approximate cost: \$14.6 million.

MARTIN COUNTY

TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF JUPITER TO SOUTH OF STUART (Milepost 117-125)

- One southbound Turnpike lane will be closed periodically between Milepost 120 and Milepost 125. One southbound lane will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.
- Monday, Oct. 1, through Friday, Oct. 5. Northbound lane may be closed between 7:30 p.m. and 6:30 a.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Jupiter (Indiantown Rd.) to south of Stuart (Martin Downs Blvd.). This resurfacing project started in April 2007 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$9.5 million.

TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF JUPITER TO NORTH OF STUART (Milepost 125-138)

- One lane in each direction will be closed periodically between Milepost 125 and Milepost 138 Monday, Oct. 1, through Friday, Oct. 5.
- Northbound lane closed between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.; southbound lane closed between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Jupiter (Indiantown Rd.) to north of Stuart (Martin Downs Boulevard). This resurfacing project started in October 2006 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$10.4 million.

ST. LUCIE COUNTY

TURNPIKE RESURFACING – NORTH OF STUART TO NORTH OF FORT PIERCE (Milepost 138-153)

- One lane in each direction may be closed periodically between Milepost 142 and Milepost 152. One lane in each direction will remain open. No closure will extend for more than two miles.

- Monday, Oct. 1, through Friday, Oct. 5, between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Milling and resurfacing of Florida's Turnpike from north of Stuart (Martin Downs Blvd.) to north of Fort Pierce (SR 70/Okeechobee Rd.) This resurfacing project started in September 2006 and is scheduled for completion in late 2007. Approximate cost: \$15.8 million.



Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is part of the Florida Department of Transportation overseeing a 454-mile system of limited-access toll highways: the Florida's Turnpike, extending north from Homestead in Miami-Dade County to Wildwood in Sumter County, the Seminole Expressway and Southern Connector (Toll 417) in Seminole, Orange and Osceola counties, the Beachline Expressway West (Toll 528) in Orange County, the Polk Parkway (Toll 570) in Polk County, the Veterans Expressway and Suncoast Parkway in Hillsborough, Pasco and Hernando counties (Toll 589), the Sawgrass Expressway (Toll 869) in Broward County, and the Daniel Webster Western Beltway Part C (Toll 429) in Orange County.

SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's innovative Prepaid Toll Program. SunPass can be used on Florida's toll roads and most toll bridges.
